Bulgaria-Japan partnership expanding

Bulgaria celebrates the anniversary of its longsought liberation on March 3 — the day the country reappeared on the European map after five centuries

of foreign rule. Upon gaining sovereignty in 1878, Bulgaria embarked on a path of modernization at almost the same time that the Meiji Restoration began in Japan. Railways and factories were built at a fast pace, and by the end of the 19th century - a mere 20 years or so - Bulgaria's economy had grown more

The geographic distance between our two countries was never an obstacle to official contacts. In 1909, Prince Kuni Kuniyoshi was the first member of the Imperial family to visit Bulgaria.

We are also proud to acknowledge that a noble Japanese national fought for the liberation of Bulgaria: Baron Seigo Yamazawa was a military correspondent, an officer in the Imperial Japanese Army and a descendant of a samural family from the Satsuma domain. He took part in the battle for the city of Pleven, which was crucial for the liberation of Bulgaria in 1878.

These instances underline the long-standing connections between Bulgaria and Japan, which have nurtured mutual understanding and respect throughout the years.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the introduction of Bulgarian yoghurt to Japan, which has since become a symbol of the friendship between our countries. In 2024 we will celebrate a triple anniversary: 115 years since the first bilateral contacts, 85 years since the establishment of diplomatic relations, and 65 years since the resumption of diplomatic ties.

Today, our two nations enjoy a dynamic and multilayered partnership that continues to expand into new areas. Japan is one of Bulgaria's oldest and most important partners in the Asia-Pacific region.

The war in Ukraine, which has caused unjustified human suffering and created unprecedented challenges for global security, has again reinforced that Bulgaria and Japan are like-minded partners who share fundamental values and uphold the principles of international law. In December 2022 the Japanese government announced that it will work with international organizations in Bulgaria to provide financial assistance to the 150,000 Ukrainian refugees in Bulgaria. The Western Balkans is another geographic region where Bulgaria and Japan successfully partner in joint

projects for disaster management and offer support for small and medium-sized enterprises.

A number of Japanese companies have recognized the benefits and potential of Bulgaria's strategic geographic location and skilled workforce and have set up successful businesses in the country. In 2022, delegations from Invest Bulgaria Agency and the Bulgarian Small and Medium Enterprises Promotion Agency visited Japan to strengthen our economic ties. In recent years, Bulgaria has attracted high profile Japanese investments from such companies as the Yazaki Corporation, Sumitomo Electric, and SEGA Corporation — the most recent being a strategic investment by the Nidec Elesys Corporation, which in December 2022 opened its first European R&D center in Sofia for its electric drive division

Educational and scientific collaboration in 2022 was strengthened via a visit by the President of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences to the STS Forum in Kyoto, and through the signing of new MoUs of understanding between Bulgarian and Japanese universities.

Based on a solid foundation of mutual trust and genuine friendship, I am confident that the relationship between Bulgaria and Japan will continue to grow stronger.
