a peaceful world. Our longstanding relations are further bolstered by the exceptional friendship between the Royal and Imperial families.



Jordan is also hosting and providing a safe haven and dignified life to almost 10 percent of the world's refugees, giving it one of the highest per capita refugee populations in the world.

Central to achieving peace is the resolution of the Palestinian-Israeli conflict and ending the Israeli military occupation of the Occupied Palestinian Territories.
