Morocco and Japan celebrate long, lasting relations

July 30 this year marks the 24th anniversary of the enthronement of His Majesty King Mohammed VI. On this auspicious

occasion, I would like to convey my respectful greetings to their Imperial Majesties the Emperor and Empress, the members of the Imperial Family, His Excellency Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, the government

Celebrating the Kingdom of Morocco's National Day in Japan is a great opportunity to highlight the long and lasting relations existing between Morocco and Japan, cemented by mutual respect and deep friendship between the Moroccan Royal Family and the Japanese Imperial Family.

Three years after the breakout of the COVID-19 pandemic, the world is witnessing systemic challenges stemming from profound change on the international stage, which could potentially hinder post-COVID economic recovery efforts being carried out by countries worldwide, including Morocco.

Morocco's economic and industrial strategy has provided the country with a resilient and flourishing business environment, illustrated by an industrial exports net worth of \$37 billion for the year 2022. Industrial clusters, bringing together manufacturers, suppliers and logistics providers, have been created in major industrial hubs in the country, in order to provide foreign investors with the best operating environment. Furthermore, Morocco has heavily invested in human resources development, creating a competitive advantage by providing a highly skilled workforce at optimum cost.

As a result, several Japanese companies, including in the automotive industry, opened up factories or re-located production plants from Europe to Morocco. Today, 75 Japanese companies operate in the country, making Morocco the second most popular location for Japanese companies in Africa, and Japanese companies the largest group of foreign private employers in Morocco, with more than 55,000 local jobs generated.

Economic resilience has also been built through a strong legal framework that provides security in economic relations. In April 2022, two important bilateral Agreements on the Promotion and Protection of Investments and on the Non-Double Taxation Convention entered into force, providing both Morocco and Japan with further legal and financial incentives and protection to take their economic and trade relations to the next level. In March this year, an additional step was taken by Morocco and Japan to strengthen their joint legal framework, with the authorization of imports to Japan of Moroccan mandarins and clementines.

Global issues such as food security, energy security and climate change mitigation are more acute than ever. In this context, Morocco has undertaken, for some years already, a strategy for building resilience in these areas, through strong investments in renewable energy and green hydrogen, as well as in the fertilizer industry. Structural projects like the Morocco-Nigeria gas pipeline and other infrastructure projects in the field of sustainable energy and food

security would provide for supply chain diversification and resilience for Morocco's partners.

To conclude, I would also like to commend the excellence of relations between Morocco and Japan, which have undergone steady development in recent years, at all levels. I am also glad to note that Morocco and Japan have a shared vision for economic and social co-prosperity, and that they have several opportunities to work together to that end.
