The COVID-19 pandemic has posed challenges as well as provided new opportunities, further deepening the India-Japan partnership. Due to proactive steps taken by the Government of India, the cumulative number of COVID-19 infections per million of the population is below

more than 100 countries. Similar is the case with the number of deaths per million. India has administered nearly 540 million doses of indigenously manufactured vaccines to its citizens and has contributed a fur-

nously manufactured vaccines to its citizens and has contributed a further 66 million doses directly or through the COVAX Facility to more than 95 countries. The entire COVID-19 vaccine rollout in India is being monitored through the effective digital COVID-19 Vaccine Intelligence Network (Co-VMIN).

Japan has been a reliable partner during the second wave of the pandemic in India, through its emergency assistance of 2,800 oxygen concentrators and 1,800 vantilators. Both countries continue to cooperate in collectively fighting the pandemic, including under the QUAD framework, which aims to deliver up to 1 billion vaccine doses to developing countries by the end of 2022. The India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership is based on the strong foundation of shared values such as democracy, freedom and respect for rule of law. Our strategic partnership is reflected in a vast array of institutional mechanisms, including annual summits and

2+2 ministerial dialogues. The year, 2022 will mark the 70th anniversary of the establishment of our diplomatic relations. As we look ahead at this important milestone, the recently launched India-Japan Forum brought together think tanks, academicians, businessmen, media representatives and government stakeholders from both countries to discuss ways to strengthen the partnership.

and Japanese-supported projects,
which include the Delhi Metro and
the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High
Speed Rail (MAHSR) project using
shinkansen technology, are among
the most iconic infrastructure ventures in India. To explore the potential of complementarities of our demographics, India and Japan recently agreed on a basic partnership
framework for operation of the
"Specified Skilled Worker" system,
Japan's contribution to capacity
building in India is already visible in
the 17 Japan-India Institutes for
Manufacturing and seven Japan
Endowed Courses that have been
established in India by Japan.
India continues to take proactive
steps to maintain its high-growth tra-

steps to maintain its high-growth tra-jectory toward its goal of becoming a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. We have undertaken a series of reforms in the labor, tax and investment

codes to enhance the ease of doing business. These efforts have led India to improve its ranking, from 142 (in 2014) to 63 (2019) in the World Bank's " Ease of Doing Business Rankings 2020." As a pathway for future, the dynamics of supply and demand and the complementarity between the countries can facilitate new, innovative and alternate models of partnership. To make this possible, both countries need to come together to "co-innovate" and global markets by combining their strength and competitiveness. India Japan Digital Partnership explores synergies between Japan's "Society 5.0" policy and India's "Digital India" initiatives. With rapidly increasing active internet users in India, opportunities in frontier technologies such as 5G, big data analytics, quantum computing, to name some, are promising. It is pertinent to note that India is home to the third-largest startupe cosystem in the world — with more than 50,000

third-largest startup ecosystem in the world – with more than 50,000 startups, 10,000-plus tech startups and is emerging as a global hub for innovation. The leadership teams of 45% of startups include women entrepreneurs.

India envisions a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific, based on the principle of Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR). The Indo Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) by India is a useful framework that draws on the existing regional coop-eration architecture and mecha-nisms to focus on seven central pillars of maritime security; maritime ecology; maritime resources; capacity building and resource sharing; disaster risk reduction and management; science, technology and aca-demic cooperation and trade con-nectivity and maritime transport. Japan is the lead country for the

Japan is the lead country for the connectivity pillar in this endeavor. Espousing the spirit of Vasudeva Kutumbakam or the world is one family, India has continued to look for so-lutions to global problems through key initiatives such as International Solar Alliance, Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure and the more recent Supply Chain Resilience Initiative. Today, renewable energy sources constitute 38% of Indias total inistalled capacity, a testament to the country's commitment to clean energy and the fight against climate change.


